WELCOME MARCH

...a month that brings with it a change of seasons. Whether you are heading into spring or into fall, the world will start to look different this month. The light will change and the colors around us will change. As photographers, those things invite us to see from a new perspective.

Too much change at once can be disconcerting, but as long as we are embracing change, this may be the month to try some new or different things with your daily photos as well. Maybe you have a lens that you haven't used in awhile. Put it on your camera and use it for a week. If you feel like you are getting bogged down in daily activities and daily photos are becoming burdensome, shoot with only your phone or allow yourself only a few shots to accomplish your picture of the day. Stepping outside our comfort zone every now and then ultimately will help us grow and improve our skills.

For those of us in the northern hemisphere, March brings us spring. The earth will start to explode with all the colors of the rainbow. You may think it unfair of us to have chosen black and white as the color of the month. To create a black and white image, most people convert an image shot in color. Another thing you may want to try this month is actually shooting in black and white. If you are using a DSLR, your camera likely has a monochrome or similar setting. Removing the "distraction" of color from the frame when composing your photo changes what you are drawn to in the frame. Texture, balance, and the play between light and shadow become the prominent features in the image. If you haven't taken many black and white photos or don't think you enjoy shooting without color, try to keep an open mind. You'll be amazed at how beautiful spring flowers can be even in black and white!

We are looking forward to seeing what this change of seasons looks like where you are!

EXPLAINING THE PROMPTS

Each month is broken into 4 weekly themes: Picture You, Picture More, Picture Color and Picture Style. These are meant to fuel your imagination, keep you engaged, and challenge your creativity. They give you the opportunity to see the same things in different ways.

PICTURE YOU - Possibly the biggest challenge, but it allows you to chronicle your life and to be included in photos for loved ones who want to have photos of you, even if you don't like how you look that day. You don't HAVE to be in the picture every day, but we would love to see you.

During Picture You week you will notice some sub-challenges:

Sunday Selfie - Sunday of Picture You week you're encouraged to take a selfie, nothing fancy, just your wonderful face.

Picture My Hands - What are you doing today? Show us what you're doing or holding from your point of view and be sure to include your hands.

Picture the Alphabet - Have you seen the letter "E" in a fence or "O" in a ferris wheel? Find letters in your world, or, if you can't find them, make them even with just a piece of paper and a marker. Let the letter stand out! You will see two letters for the prompt. We want two photos in a collage for your daily photo. By the end of the year you will have 26 letter photos to make words.

Picture My World - This is a quarterly challenge. We are hoping you can return to the same spot 4 times on these days to document the changing seasons in your world or in your life.

PICTURE MORE - Let's get technical! This will challenge your creativity with a technical agenda. In these weeks of your year you will look at repetition, triangles, diagonals, textures, centred photos (to name a few!). Don't be shy to ask for clarification, camera settings or any tips and tricks. We aren't magicians here, we share our secrets!

PICTURE COLOR - We will focus on a specific color chosen by the Creative Team for these weeks. You can include a little of the color, go completely monochrome or anything in between. You will likely find that this is one of your favourite weeks.

PICTURE STYLE - Landscape, food, golden hour, still life, street, minimalist are just some of the styles you will be encouraged to play around with to try out something new. Some of these might be a little out of your comfort zone. Our hope is that by the end of the week you may have discovered something you love. You might find style in your original photo or add some style in post-processing.

EXTRA CHALLENGES

Along the way you'll notice a few added monthly challenges sprinkled in to give you extra inspiration.

Macro Monday - For this prompt we encourage you to get in close. Grab your macro lens, macro filters or just crop your photo in post-processing. This is where we can focus on the little details.

Scavenger Hunt - A quarterly challenge where instead of one prompt, you have 9. Take the 9 photos and make a collage. If a scavenger hunt is a bit beyond you that day, see if you can challenge yourself to fit 3 prompts in three different photos, or all nine in one. Make it work for you and your day.

Picture Recreate - In this challenge, all we want you to do is recreate an existing photo, whether that's a Pinterest photo you've been wanting to try, a photo from a fellow 365er you loved, or a photo of you and your siblings in the bathtub when you were 5. As always, you can be as creative or literal as you want.

In photography, the golden hour is described as being the period of daytime shortly after sunrise or before sunset. During these times, the daylight is often softer than when the sun is high in the sky.

You are going to have to be very deliberate with your photography this week if you are going to capture these brief moments in our day. To some this will mean maybe getting up a little earlier, or perhaps briefly stopping your busy day for a moment at sundown to enjoy the evening sky. You might further be challenged by weather! Maybe its raining, or freezing or you just don't feel like getting outside during the golden hour! You might have to get creative to find that special golden light. If the day is not quite cooperating for you, try using a golden filter on a photograph. If all else fails, you can photograph something gold!

There was a magnificent sunset behind me as I photographed this dormant canola field. I liked how the setting sun made the stubble glow and the snow appear purple! To me it is glorious.

MARCH 11 WISDOM

Picture STYLE

Golden Hour

One of my favorite types of photos to take during the golden hour is silhouettes. They give us a perfect opportunity to show the wisdom of Mother Nature. Give it a try today. Silhouettes are easier to achieve than you might think.

Here are the basic steps to capturing a silhouette:

- Your subject should be bold, clearly defined shapes and ideally your surroundings should be uncluttered.
- Place your subject in front of a light source. A rising or setting sun is the perfect light. Ideally, the sun should be just above the horizon. In this photo, the sun is a little high, but it worked OK for my subject and surroundings.
- Expose your photo for the brightest part of the frame (the sun). This will underexpose your subject creating the silhouette.
- You may need to move left and right or up and down to create the best play between the light and your subject.
- In post processing, you may need to up the contrast and or the blacks to create a true silhouette. In doing this, be careful not to destroy all of your highlights.

Low Key - Sunday Selfie

YES! I love low key photography! Low key images can be achieved by shooting dark-colored scenes by lowering or dimming the "key" (or front) light illuminating a scene and then emphasizing natural or artificial light only on specific areas in the scene. When looking at your histogram most of the tonal range falls in the darker tones and shadows. I love the moodiness and mystery this type of photography can create. I took this photo while having the sunlight fall directly on the left side of my face which created the deep shadows on the opposite side of my face.

Today we are encouraging you to take that Sunday Selfie in a low key way. Converting your photo to black and white helps too (which is helpful considering we just did black and white week).

This week will challenge you to really look for stunning light and shadows!

MARCH 28 **STIRRING** Low Key

As we learn more about low key photography this week, are you finding it challenging or is it something you enjoy doing? It can be tricky to do but it makes for such interesting photos don't you think?

I went to the Van Gogh exhibit last year and I found it extremely stirring. I loved it. I took this photo while at the exhibit. It was a dark room, so the lighting was low. The image was shown on the screen with the light on the right side so when taking the photo, it gave a low key feel to it. It gives a dark moody feeling to the image.

What stirs emotion in you? How can you photograph utilizing low key lighting? Or you can simply use your spoon and stir something as you photograph it. Define it in whatever manner works for you and give low key photography a try.

MARCH 30 EXCELLENT Low Key

Picture YOU

Eggcellent - I am sorry I just couldn't help it!

I found it difficult to find a photograph in my archives to use as an example of "excellent" in low key! It is not something I have done much of in the past.

I did find this one from 2015. In this photo I put eggs on a black tile that I use for the purpose of getting reflections. I made the room dark and used a torch to light up the eggs slightly (light painting). I am itching to redo this photograph again because I have learned so much since my first attempt 7 years ago.

For low light photography, really do try to use a tripod and put the camera on delayed timer so that there is no shaking. Set your f stop as high as you can; my camera settings were f /22, ISO 100 (for clarity) and a 6 second exposure. This may seem like a long time, but if nothing is moving you will get a better photo.

MARCH 31 COLOSSAL Low Key



COLOSSAL means something of great power, such as high mountains, dramatic skies, volcanic explosions, giant trees, huge ocean waves, or large architectural structures. It could also be more personal, such as something that impacted you in significant ways. I chose an image of Philadelphia's 30th Street Station (railroad) colossal pillars. Long ago I'd drive my husband to this station every morning for his daily commute. It seemed trivial, but this routine had an incredible impact in our lives.

Think of something colossal in your life. It may include you, parts of you, or of significance to you. Be sure to capture your imagine in low key style, with more shadows than light but revealing key details. A good starting point for your camera settings include low ISO, low f-stop and fast shutter speed.

I can't wait to see what's colossal in your life. Have fun!
